

Ensemble To Present Experiments In Music

The New Music Choral Ensemble, a group of 24 students from the University of Illinois, will present a concert here at 8 p.m. Friday in Machride Auditorium.

The New Music group was formed in 1963 to perform new choral music, experimental compositions allowing extensive improvisation.

In "Rounds," which the group will perform Friday, the musical score is mounted on the rim of a large wheel and the singers stand around it. They sing from the score as the wheel revolves past them. "Lilacs," a choral adaptation of the Walt Whitman poem, composed by University of Iowa faculty mem-

ber Robert Shallenberg, is another work performed by the students.

The group uses drums, stereo tapes, amplifiers and other audio equipment in addition to vocal variations and is directed by Kenneth Gaburo, professor of mus-

ic at the University of Illinois.

Tickets will be available Tuesday to students, faculty and staff. Tickets are free to students who present identification cards. The ticket price is \$2. Tickets remaining Thursday will go on sale to the general public.

Bus Skids, Overtakes, Kills Unidentified Man

SPENCER (AP) — A Greyhound bus skidded and overturned near Spencer Friday, killing one passenger, a man pinned underneath the wreckage.

Authorities said the man, about 35, carried no identification.

Eleven other persons were injured one seriously, as the vehicle went out of control. The

driver said the brakes locked.

Authorities said the bus, en route from Minneapolis to Omaha, skidded on damp pavement on U.S. 71 near here. The vehicle overturned in a ditch, but windows on the high side popped open, enabling the injured to climb out.
