Piano recital

James Avery will present a piano recital at 8 p.m. tonight in Clapp Recital Hall. The program will include "Sweets for Piano," a work composed in 1965 by Peter Tod Lewis, associate professor and director of the UI Electronic Music Studio.

Avery will also perform "Auf verwachsenem Pfade" by Leos Janacek, "Papillons, Opus 2" by Robert Schumann and "Sonata in E-Flat Maior, Opus 7" by Beethoven.

No tickets will be required for admission to the faculty recital.

Avery, an associate professor and associate in performance in the School of Music, studied piano with Roy Hamlin Johnson at the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Walter Robert at Indiana University, Bioomington, and Carl Seemann in Freiburg, West Germany.

His study in Europe was made possible by two Pulbright scholarships and a grant from the German government. In 1969 Avery received a grant from the Martha Baired Rockefeller Fund for Music for a series of concerts in major European cities. For the past three seasons he has received grants from the Iowa Arts Council for concerts in the state.
