<u>Goals</u>: Composition Seminar is a course for Composition Majors. Course activities are centered on in-class presentations by students on the repertoire of electronic music in all of its forms. These forms include works for fixed sound media, instrument or voice with electronics, music and video, and live or interactive electronics.

Grading: Grades are based on participation/attendance (50%) and an in-class presentation.

<u>Presentations</u>: Each student will present the electronic music of two composers. If possible, the student should be one of the composers. The presentation should focus on the similarities and differences between both bodies of work. Undergraduate and masters students will give 25-minute presentations; PhD students will give 50-minute presentations.

Presentation Format: Presentations should follow the outline below:

- 1. Hand out a work list for each composer to be discussed.
- 2. Describe why you have selected the two composers and the works you will present. Emphasize why you think they are worthy of consideration.
- 3. Discuss the background of each composition, including the concept, aesthetic premises, technological means of realization, and impact. Do not read directly from a CD booklet. Write the name of the composer and composition on the board.
- 4. Play the music, but leave time for discussion. Play excerpts or fade out if necessary.
- 5. Lead a discussion. Be prepared to ask questions of the class to initiate a discussion. Try to include as many participants as possible.
