

025:250 Composition: Electronic Media I Importing CD tracks into Pro Tools Sept 10, 2001

- 1) Power up the studio, **Pro Tools**, and create **New Session**. Save the session as "PT.Your Name.CD" in the folder "Your Name."
- 2) Insert an CD that contains a track which you would like to import into the session.
- 3) From the menu, select Movie>Import Audio from Other Movie. In the dialog that appears, navigate into the Audio CD disk until the tracks are shown, as below.. Click "Convert."




4) A window like the one below appears.



a) Name the file and choose the location to which you wish to save the CD track. Do not click "Save" yest. Note that you cannot save to the Audio CD itself.

b) Select "Options" A dialog like the one below appears.
